- Scouts Canada youth registration runs on a CALENDAR YEAR basis
- Registration for the following Scouting year begins in late summer.
- We expect the Cub Pack to be full in the fall. Please take note of the registration period and deadlines. Scouts Canada gives returning members first chance at renewal, then opens up registration to new members. It is highly advised that if your child will return to Cubs that you register them in the August 'returning members' period.
- Group registration fees for 2025 have not yet been set but like everything else, they will increase next year.
- Scouts Canada refund policy you can get a refund on your 2025 registration up to January 2025.
