Greetings

We hope your child (or children) has enjoyed their year in our programs. We would love to see them return in the fall!

For the 2019-2020 Scouting year, 72nd Ottawa will be running Beavers (age 5-7), Cubs (age 8-10), and Venturer (age 15-18) sections at St. Rita's. Our Scouts section (age 11-14) will continue meeting with the 115th Parkwood Hills Troop on Mondays at City View United Church (6 Epworth Avenue) next year. We are working at rebuilding our Scouts-section leader base, and hopefully we will have our Scouts section back at the 72nd the following year. You can register in the fall, when **all** those back-to-school expenses come in, or you can save the hassle, and some money, by registering in May or June! Our registration fees are as follows:

- Register between May 1 (returning members only)/May 15 (new members) June 30 = \$240
- Register between July 1 December 31 (all members) = \$275

So registering before July 1 gives you a \$35 savings! And registering in May covers new and returning members from time of registration until August 2020. **NOTE:** Scouts Canada policy allows refunds to registration if a request is made *within 30 days of registration*.

If you consider that most of our programs have about 30 meetings a year, that's less than \$10/ meeting, which is comparable for the per-lesson cost for swimming, piano, etc. It's a great deal. A large part of the registration fee goes to Scouts Canada, the remaining portion is for our group to pay for school rental, badges, leader training courses, and camp subsidies.  - Hit the Find A Group button
 - Put in your postal code, and in the results look for 72nd Ottawa, do a SEARCH, when the results come up, hit DETAILS link, and you can register from there
